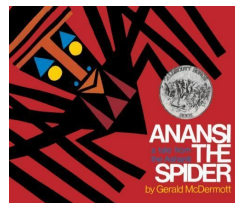
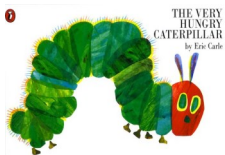




Curriculum Map– Does everything grow? Summer 1 Easter, lifecycle, child, adult, elderly, chrysalis.



On an early Sunday morning, "a tiny and very hungry caterpillar" hatches from his egg and searches for something to eat. He eats more and more every day until he gets a tummy ache.

He wraps himself into a cocoon and then emerges as a beautiful butterfly.

In trying to determine which of his six sons to reward for saving his life, Anansi the Spider is responsible for placing the moon in the sky

Cats sit on mats, hares sit on chairs, mules sit on stools and gofers sit on sofas, but Frog does not want to sit on a log! Jam-packed with animals and silliness, this original rhyming story will have young children in fits of laughter.

Eric Carle's classic story of the life cycle of a flower is told through the adventures of a tiny seed. Everyone will cheer for the seed's progress as it floats across the sky, nestles in the ground, and finally grows into the giant flower it was always meant to be.
